

About Us

In 2009, a group of UMBC students who valued the importance of computer security founded the CyberDawgs to raise awareness for all things secure computing and compete in the National CyberWatch Center's Collegiate Cyber Defense Competition (CCDC). Since then, the organization has expanded significantly, growing in size and ability to compete in various competitions.

Participating in cybersecurity competitions has always been a core aspect of the CyberDawgs. In 2015, our CCDC team won Mid-Atlantic CCDC (MACCDC) and placed fourth at the National CCDC (NCCDC). Throughout the years, with support from our academic community and sponsors like you, we have earned 1st place at both the MACCDC and NCCDC competitions, the DoE Cyberforce competition, the RIT Information Security Talent Search, and several others. Year after year, our CyberDawgs team continues to tackle greater challenges. In addition to competing in intercollegiate cybersecurity competitions, the CyberDawgs strive to share knowledge and experience. To accomplish this, we hold weekly meetings where we welcome guest speakers, including industry and government professionals, to present on a topic they're knowledgeable about, while sharing professional advice. We also host an international CTF and an annual Cyber Defense Exercise (CDE) for students to gain hands-on experience in cyber. Further, we foster an online community on Discord where questions are always welcome, and club members share cyber news, discuss personal projects, and build connections outside of classrooms and competitions.

Cyber Defense Exercise (CDE) - October 19, 2024

Cyber Defense Exercise (CDE) is our in-house red-team/blue-team competition meant to simulate a live cyber attack on a realistic company network. We emphasize the complete scope of concerns during a cyber attack, such as business continuity, service-level agreements, writing documentation, and reporting to C-Suite executives. CDE tests a student's technical skills in system administration and incident response, as well as their knowledge of general security concepts and collaborative abilities under pressure. Students also get the opportunity to interact with a range of software and tools that they may encounter in the workplace.

This structure of CDE is largely inspired by competitions run by the National CyberWatch Center and the Department of Energy. Naturally, CDE has become a primary method of recruiting students for our competition team.

We also invite sponsors to send representatives to join CDE's white team. The white team interacts directly with the student blue teams to help answer questions and communicate competition updates. They are also responsible for collecting "business injects" and grading them. You can find more details in the **Event Participation Benefits** table below.

The CyberDawgs hosted this event for the first time in Fall of 2017. Since then, the number of participating students has continued to grow each year. In Fall 2023, we had 48 students competing across 12 blue teams.

DawgCTF - April 18, 2025 (Tentative)

DawgCTF is a 3-day capture-the-flag (CTF) competition designed to appeal to all levels of cyber experience. It is a Jeopardy-style CTF in which we provide local, national, and international student competitors with challenges to solve that give them points upon completion. The team with the most points at the end of the competition wins. Challenge categories typically include reverse engineering, digital forensics, binary exploitation, web exploitation, steganography, cryptography, incident response, and general coding, but we encourage challenge writers to invent unique problems for the competitors. We invite UMBC students to form teams and compete on campus during the first day of the event, with prizes going to the group with the most points at the end of the day.

In the past, students have thoroughly enjoyed solving challenges from our sponsors, and we are always excited and willing to incorporate additional sponsor challenges. You can find more details in the **Event Participation Benefits** table below.

DawgCTF was first held in the Spring of 2017, and we plan to host every year in the Spring. Each year garnering more and more participants. In Spring 2023, we had 560 active users compete across 414 teams and received almost 9000 "flag" submissions across 63 challenges in a 72-hour period.
